

2024-2025 Regional Tournament Study Guide - Gamma Question Set

Instructions: This study guide should be your first resource in preparing for the International Geography Bee Regional Tournaments on the Gamma Question Set. Many of the facts below are found at some point in the 120 questions that compose the Gamma Question Set. Thus we have selected these facts for this study guide to help make your preparation easier and more efficient. Other facts in the study guide will be contained within the Beta Question Sets later in the year, so this can also serve as a good introduction to those questions. Remember that the questions are all short paragraphs on a particular topic, so if a topic is referenced below, then it is a good idea to learn a bit more about it on your own (since additional facts about a topic will also be referenced in the question). It is also helpful to read the introduction of a Wikipedia page on a topic to gain additional context about why it is significant. Please also use the National Capitals Study Guide and our past question sets (especially Geography Bee Regional Finals questions from past years) which are both found here. Many of the topics that are found in past years' questions will again be found in the questions at this year's Regional Tournaments, and at the Asian Championships too. Good luck!

African Geography

- 1. Algeria, the largest African country by area, has its capital at Algiers.
- 2. The <u>Nile River</u> is the longest river in Africa. It flows north through Sudan & <u>Egypt</u> before flowing into the <u>Mediterranean Sea</u>.
- 3. An East African channel is named for Mozambique, a Portuguese-speaking country with a capital at Maputo.
- 4. The largest city by population in Nigeria is Lagos, which once served as the country's capital.
- 5. The many endemic species of Madagascar include over 100 types of lemur, including the ring-tailed variety.
- 6. Lake Tanganyika has a maximum depth of almost 5,000 feet and is part of Africa's Great Lakes.
- 7. <u>Lesotho</u> is a landlocked country completely surrounded by South Africa. Its capital and largest city is Maseru.

Asian Geography

- 1. Tokyo, the capital of Japan, is the world's largest urban area by population.
- 2. <u>India</u> & <u>Bangladesh</u> border the <u>Bay of Bengal</u>, an arm of the Indian Ocean which receives the <u>Brahmaputra</u> & Ganges Rivers.
- 3. While Beijing serves as the country's capital, China's wealthiest city by GDP is Shanghai.
- 4. The <u>cedar tree</u> is a national emblem of <u>Lebanon</u>, a country in <u>the Levant</u> on the eastern shore of the Mediterranean Sea that has its capital at <u>Beirut</u>.
- 5. Located west of the <u>South China Sea</u>, <u>Vietnam</u> is the most populous country on the continental mainland of <u>Southeast Asia</u>.

- 6. Named for its high salinity, the shores of the Dead Sea are the lowest land-based point on Earth.
- 7. Petra is an ancient, rock-carved city in Jordan.
- 8. Gambling is a major industry in <u>Macau</u>, a special administrative region of China and former <u>Portuguese</u> colony.
- 9. Located in Cambodia, Angkor Wat is the largest religious complex on Earth by total area.
- 10. Mount Everest, the Earth's highest mountain above sea level, is a peak in the Himalayas.

Australia & Oceania Geography

- 1. A world famous opera house is located in the harbor of Sydney, Australia.
- 2. Explorer <u>James Cook</u> names the <u>strait</u> that divides the two main islands of <u>New Zealand</u>. These islands are called North Island and South Island.
- 3. <u>Easter Island</u>, also known as Rapa Nui, belongs to the nation of Chile, but is considered part of Polynesia. It is known for its large statues of human heads known as *moai*.

European Geography

- 1. The <u>Trevi Fountain</u> and the Spanish Steps are tourist attractions located in <u>Rome</u>, the capital of <u>Italy</u>.
- 2. Malta, one of Europe's few island countries, has its capital at Valletta.
- 3. Bavaria is a German state known worldwide for its Oktoberfest celebration in Munich.
- 4. Tuscany is a region of Italy known for its food and arts, especially in cities like Pisa and Florence.
- 5. Reykjavik, the capital of Iceland, is the northernmost national capital in the world.
- 6. Romania is a country on the Balkan Peninsula of Europe that is bordered by Ukraine and Hungary.
- 7. Located in Central Europe, Liechtenstein is the world's smallest country to border two other countries.
- 8. The 2024 Summer Olympics were hosted in Paris, France.
- 9. The Alps is a mountain range that borders France, Switzerland, Italy, Germany, Austria, and Slovenia.
- 10. The Danube River flows through ten Central and Eastern European countries, including Austria and Croatia.

U.S. & Canadian Geography

- 1. San Francisco is located at the southern end of the Golden Gate Bridge, across from Marin County.
- 2. Victoria and Vancouver are cities in the Canadian province of British Columbia.
- 3. The city with the highest population in Canada's French-speaking province of Quebec is Montreal.

Latin American and Caribbean Geography

- 1. Mexico City is both the largest city by population in Mexico and all of North America.
- 2. The <u>Galápagos Islands</u> are administered by <u>Ecuador</u>. They are known for their unique wildlife including the world's northernmost species of penguin, and various species of finches which were studied by Charles Darwin.
- 3. <u>São Paulo</u> is the most populous city in <u>Brazil</u>, as well as the largest city by population in both the western and southern hemispheres.
- 4. Haiti is a French-speaking island country in the Caribbean that has a capital at Port-au-Prince.
- 5. San Jose is the capital of Costa Rica, which is bordered by Nicaragua and Panama.
